THEATRICAL PUPPET CONSTRUCTION VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

THEATERWORKS New Harmony is looking for local visual artists and craftspersons to assist in the construction of theatrical puppets for a family adaptation of Charles Dickens' *A Christmas Carol* to premiere at Murphy Auditorium, during "Christmas in New Harmony", December 2024. "The Spirit of Christmas Present" puppet for this show was featured on the Kiwanis float in the New Harmony Christmas parade this past year. It is one of over two dozen puppets planned for the production, ranging in size from 2 to 10 feet tall. These puppets are being constructed from a variety of materials, mostly recycled. Depending upon each character's function and design, they will be made from a combination of paper-mache, plywood, bamboo, chicken-wire and fabric sculpture. A few of the puppets will even require original, over-sized period costumes. So, sculpting, drafting, illustrating, painting, sewing, tailoring, woodworking, or just general handicraft and ingenuity are all desirable skills. There will also be many "unskilled" preparation tasks for those who just want to lend a hand, while enjoying the camaraderie of this group project. Volunteers will be assigned tasks that match their skills, interest and availability.

The puppets are being constructed at **THEATERWORKS New Harmony**, housed in the Old Train Depot, at the corner of Raintree and North Streets.
